

## WELTED SCARF

The welted scarf provides interesting texture but is very easy to work. Any smooth yarn will show off the pattern, have fun experimenting!

### Skills Needed

General knitting skills.

### Sizes

One size, 5" wide x 50" long.

### Materials

#### Yarn

3 skeins Blue Sky Alpaca's Sport Weight (100% baby Alpaca, 50g, 110 yards).

Substitute any smooth textured yarn in sport-worsted weight.

#### Needles

#5 needles or appropriate size for yarn.

### Gauge

This will depend upon your yarn; sample is 20 sts= 4" over St st. Row gauge not important.

### Abbreviations

#### Welts

The welts are worked on the WS as follows:  
\*with yarn in front, insert needle from the top down into the head of the purl st 5 rows below the next st on needle; pick up this loop, place it on left-hand needle and purl it together with next st; rep from \* for as many sts as desired, at least 6 consecutive sts.

## Directions

CO 24 sts and work 5 rows St st beg with a k row. In row 6 (WS) work welts as described above on every st across the row. Cont in St st for a further 5 rows, then work welts over 6–15 consecutive sts anywhere in the row. Cont randomly placing welts on WS every 6–8 rows until piece measures 6", then work welts every 12–14 rows. Cont until piece measures 44", then switch back to working welts every 6–8 rows. When piece measures 50", work a further 5 rows St st. In last row, work welt on every st across row as you BO.

Weave in ends and lightly block.
